PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

As a charter school, we follow a structured process for enrolling students into our schools. Our policy for enrollment has remained consistent since 2013 that new students are assigned to our school by the U Prep Schools Enrollment Coordinator. The process allows for siblings of currently enrolled students and children of district employees to receive priority in the enrollment process, but only if those students apply during our open enrollment period. Otherwise all students are admitted on a first-come, first-served basis. CORE CURRICULUM

Core curriculum is the standard curriculum covering each subject area and all grade levels. The Core Curriculum of UPA High School is aligned with the Michigan Department of Education's Curriculum Framework. Daily lesson plans are present in all classrooms, with daily learning targets explaining what is being taught and how it is being assessed.

THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

Beginning in the 2015-2016 school year, 9th- 11th grade students at University Prep Academy High School take the PSAT and SAT (11th grade) to measure learning to determine college readiness. In past years the PLAN, EXPLORE, and ACT was used as the nationally normed achievement test. The table below shows our average students' Spring score PLAN, EXPLORE, and ACT tests for the 2013 – 14 and 2014-2015 school year.
