






### A Message From Our CEO

# **UPA Raises Funds for Local Non-Profits Benefitting the Black Community**

U Prep Academy raised money for three local Detroit nonprofits through the sale of Black Lives Matter hoodies and tees in August. The effort was created by a group of students working with U Prep Academy High School Dean of Culture Jerry Lawrence. All of the funds raised from the sale of these hoodies AND t-shirts will go to support these three Detroit nonprofits:

- Detroit Phoenix Center
- Detroit Black Community Food Security Network
- Detroit Justice Center

This fundraising campaign was initiated to raise awareness and fund local non-profits that are doing the work that is "needed to continue to advance Black people, Black families, and Black communities in our city. The second goal was to further instill a deep sense of Black pride within our student body," Lawrence told us.

The effort raised \$1,820, exceeding their goal of \$1,500. The items are no longer for sale. Thank you to all who supported our efforts!
