It was a good feeling to see our students "win" and achieve their goals.

What advice would you give Middle School students so they are well prepared for college?

It is never too early to start thinking about college and careers. If there is something that you are passionate about, that you love doing and that brings you joy, explore that and identify how you can turn your passion into a career. Once you find your passion, explore every possible opportunity you can to build on that skill. Find ways to be the best there is at what you want to do.

What advice would you give High School students so they are well prepared for college?

Getting good grades is important and will get you into college but finding a goal that you are passionate about will build you the resilience you need to get through college.

Every year I have a parent who tell me how grateful they are that we helped their child graduate and make it to college.
